## **ENRICHMENT PROGRAM FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS OFFERED ON 15TH STREET CAMPUS**

Several courses will be offered on the Fifteenth Street campus this summer for high school juniors and seniors. Students in the program may earn college credit while still attending high school through the Accelerated Enrichment Program in the Office Administration Division of Shelton State Community College.

Some of the courses to be offered include: typing; keyboarding; office machines; computer courses; secretarial accounting; speedwriting/shorthand; and other academic classes.

To enroll in the program, a student must have a "B" average and be recommended by the high school principal or superintendent.
