MISSION

To coordinate Wartime Host Nation Support for the wartime reception, staging, onward movement, and sustainment of US Forces in Korea.



WHNS DEFINITION

Military and civilian resources and assistance provided by the ROK for the reception, onward movement, and sustainment of US forces, <u>in times of crisis</u>, <u>hostilities</u>, or war, as set forth in agreements between the US and ROK governments.







POW Camp Security:


 Security personnel requested by the US to provide security at POW Camps are included in the "Personnel" portion of this WHNS (plan).

Installation Security:

 Existing contract providing installation security guards services to USFK installations has been exempted from mobilization and personnel will remain available for security services to US

UNFORESEEN PROCESS

- Unpredictable Nature of War
- We've increased the quantity & quality of the requests during Exercises
- Competes with and Receives Second Priority to ROK Execution of the WSP
- UFL&RSOI Experience: ROK MND Logistics Bureau has hard time processing requests.

WHNS Testing

Command Post Exercises (CPX) Field Training Exercise (FTX) Site Survey (SS) Coordination Exercise (COORDEX) Communication Exercises (COMEX)



Field Training Exercise (FTX)

* An exercise approved and coordinated by ROK MND and USKF-J4 WHNS in which partial assets or complete assets listed in a WHNS Record are activated, called forward, provided to US unit, and then returned to the ROK providing source(s).

* Depending on the type of asset, some assets maybe be permanently maintained by the US unit.

* Funded by C/J-3 Exercise Division.



Site Survey (SS)

* An event, preferably combined, in which a US unit conducts a terrain walk of an area, facility, and/or delivery site listed in an approved WHNS record.

* The intent is to validate the required area, update sketches, strip maps, confirm link-up locations and plans, and review requirements, etc.



Coordination Exercise (COORDEX)

An event in which US and ROK units validate and refine how a WHNS asset and/or service will be transferred, review associated checklists for receipt of WHNS, confirm appropriate WHNS forms are on hand, and refine units' SOPs.

Sumits must conduct internal COORDEXs to ensure they have included in their mission analysis -- link-up coordination, receipt procedures, transfer procedures, removal/distribution procedures, sustainment procedures, and



Communications Exercise (COMEX)

* An exercise in which US units validate ROK POC information in a WHNS Record(s) from the existing approved WHNS Plan by contacting the ROK unit to validate phone number, dialing procedures, and ROK POC acknowledgement of the WHNS Record.



RELATED PROGRAMS

- Wartime Movement Plan (WMP) (C/J/G-4 Trans)
 - Provides movement through a combined system to a combined force
 - WHNS is limited to ROK support to US Forces
 - General Rule: If you want to hire a moving van, it's WMP. If you want to rent a truck for a while, it's WHNS.

NEO Support (JTF NEO)

Viewed by ROK as outside the scope of the WHNS Umbrella Agreement

 Use the US Embassy - Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade link (MOFAT)

- Wartime Critical Contracts & Pre-planned Contingency Contracting (J4 WHNS)
 - Mechanisms for arranging support outside of mobiliz
 - WCC: Armistice contract to continue during continge
 - PCC: On-the-shelf contract for contingencies
 Can be used for NEO
